The Bible says this way of remembering Jesus is for people who have become Christians through personally repenting of their sins and accepting Jesus' sacrifice as the only way they can be put right with a Holy God. When indicated that the service includes communion, the bread and wine will be brought to you in your seats. If you have made this personal commitment to the Lord Jesus Christ then we are happy for you to join us in the bread and wine. If this is not where you are yet in your relationship with Jesus then we are happy for you to stay and enjoy the service but please pass the bread and wine along to the next person when it is passed to you.

They publish resources in braille, giant print, audio and electronic media. and operate a large free postal library of Christian books in accessible media with literature going to 100 countries across the globe.

Torch operates a Holiday and Retreat Centre in Sussex offering more opportunity for fellowship for visually impaired people, young and old.

The International office is based near Blantyre in Malawi. Here a team of five African staff operate a braille unit producing Bibles and other books in African languages.
